# Lawn Bowls



## Rules:

- A ball can be propelled by rolling, throwing or kicking. Pupils may use a ramp if necessary.
  - All players must release their ball behind the throwing line.
    - Each team will have 4 balls.
    - The game finishes when a team reaches 11 points.
- One team rolls the jack and then a coloured ball. Each team takes it in turns to rolled their coloured balls.
  - All balls must be within the designated area to score.
- Once all the balls have been rolled, the team with the nearest ball to the jack will score a point. This team will score additional points for each ball that they have nearer to the jack than the opposing team.

Pupils will be awarded medals and certificates for taking part in this activity.
